Play 60/Read 20

Research shows that children who are physically active have better test scores and higher literacy rates. On Sept. 9, the Washington Redskins Charitable Foundation combined the benefits of the NFL Play 60 program, a league-wide campaign to increase the wellness of young fans by encouraging them to be active for at least 60 minutes a day, with the Redskins Read program to help kick off the school year and promote both healthy bodies and minds. The first Play 60/ Read 20 event took place at Dumfries Elementary School in Dumfries, Va.,

where students rotated with Redskins players around different areas of the school and took part in Zumba exercises, reading activities and, finally, a chance to pick out a new backpack and school supplies, all provided by the Redskins Charitable Foundation. In total, eight players spent the morning with the students, including running back Alfred Morris, fullback Darrel Young, tight end Niles Paul, guard Shawn Lauvao, long snapper Nick Sundberg, kicker Kai Forbath, punter Tress Way and linebacker Keenan Robinson.















Redskins Read Challenge

Students in grades K-6 in Washington D.C., the Counties of Prince George's and Montgomery in Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia are encouraged to read throughout the school year to become a Redskins Read Book Challenge Champion! Track the number of minutes read between Sept. 22, 2014 and March 15, 2015 with 10 minutes of reading equal to one "reading yard." Students who gain at least 100 reading

yards (or 1,000 minutes) are eligible to be nominated as a Redskins Read Challenge Champion by a parent, guardian or teacher. All Champions will receive a Redskins Read Challenge reading certificate and be entered to win additional Redskins prizes! 

Sack Cancer Gala and Friday Night Lights

uring the month of October, the Washington Redskins along with the other 31 NFL clubs joined together to help raise awareness and resources to battle breast cancer. The league-wide initiative, known as "A Crucial Catch," includes the Redskins Breast Cancer Awareness game and features the distribution of thousands of pink ribbons to fans, pink equipment for the players and coaches, and pink on-field decorations from goal posts to game balls.

This cause is especially important to owner Dan Snyder and his wife, Tanya Snyder. Mrs. Snyder, a breast cancer





survivor, started the campaign in the NFL for Breast Cancer Awareness in 1999, establishing an initiative later adopted by all 31 other NFL clubs. Mrs. Snyder now serves as the NFL Breast Cancer Spokesperson and has helped make the color pink a staple for the NFL in the month of October.

The Redskins Charitable Foundation utilized this platform to launch a new initiative for Breast Cancer Awareness called "Friday Night Lights: Think Pink!" to give local high schools the chance to take part and learn the importance of giving back early. Three Fairfax County high schools each hosted their own "pinked out" matchups, complete with the same pink equipment used during the Redskins' game. In addition to an honorary



Redskins captain attending each game for the coin toss, each high school was provided with pink t-shirts to sell before each game as well as other pink game equipment donated by the Charitable Foundation. All proceeds from t-shirt sales directly benefited the American Cancer Society with schools raising close to \$10,000 throughout the month.

On Oct. 17, the Redskins Charitable Foundation also teamed up with the American Cancer Society to host the inaugural Sack Cancer Gala at the Ritz-Carlton in Tyson's Corner. This event honored Robert G. Hisaoka, President of RRR, LLC and Chairman of Carsquare, as well as Redskins Alumnus Chris Cooley, for their passionate efforts to support those battling cancer. The gala brought together hundreds of supporters, as well as survivors of the disease, for an evening of fine dining, live entertainment and a celebration of life.

Season of Sharing




Macy's created a store within a store by sectioning off an event space and transforming it into a winter wonderland for the children as they selected coats from a variety of different styles


