Harry Reid has served in the U.S. Senate for the past 24 years. Prior to his election to the Senate, Harry Reid earned his law degree from George Washington University. Harry Reid previously served two terms in the U.S. House of Representatives. Harry Reid's past elected positions include tenure as Nevada's Lieutenant Governor, Chairman of the Nevada Gaming Commission, Capitol Police Office, and service in the Nevada State Assembly.

Since 2004, Harry Reid has served as the Majority Leader, the highest ranking leadership position in the Senate. While in the Senate, Harry Reid has worked to create jobs by passing the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 and helped to prevent home foreclosures by passing the Foreclosure Prevention Act of 2008. Senator Reid also played an important role in securing \$400 million in funding for Nevada's schools, colleges and universities in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. In 2010, he passed the Travel Promotion Act which establishes a multi-million dollar public-private partnership to promote the United States as a premier travel destination and better explain travel security policies to foreign travelers.

In 2009, MGM Resorts International was close to shuttering CityCenter as financing had dried up in the wake of the financial industry's collapse. Harry Reid called the CEOs of the Company's lenders urging them not to ignore the project. This outreach is credited with saving 22,000 jobs.
