

Maryam Rajavi's Ten-point Plan for Iran's Future

Free Iran World Summit 2024 Roadmap to a Democratic Republic

President-elect of the National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI)

1. Rejection of velayat-e faqih (absolute clerical rule). Affirmation of the people's sovereignty in a republic founded on universal suffrage and pluralism;
2. Freedom of speech, freedom of political parties, freedom of assembly, freedom of the press and the internet. Dissolution and disbanding of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), the terrorist Quds Force, plainclothes groups, the unpopular Bassij, the Ministry of Intelligence, Council of the Cultural Revolution, and all suppressive patrols and institutions in cities, villages, schools, universities, offices, and factories;
3. Commitment to individual and social freedoms and rights in accordance with the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Disbandment of all agencies in charge of censorship and inquisition. Pursuit of justice for massacred political prisoners, prohibition of torture, and the abolishment of the death penalty;
4. Separation of religion and state, and freedom of religions and faiths;
5. Complete gender equality in the realms of political, social, cultural, and economic rights, and equal participation of women in political leadership. Abolition of any form of discrimination; the right to choose one's own clothing freely; the right to freely marry and divorce, and to obtain education and employment. Prohibition of all forms of exploitation against women under any pretext;
6. An independent judiciary and legal system consistent with international standards based on the presumption of innocence, the right to defense counsel, right of appeal, and the right to be tried in a public court. Full independence of judges. Abolition of the mullahs' Sharia law and dissolution of Islamic Revolutionary Courts;
7. Autonomy for and removal of double injustices against Iranian nationalities and ethnicities consistent with the National Council of Resistance of Iran's plan for the autonomy of Iranian Kurdistan;
8. Justice and equal opportunities in the realms of employment and entrepreneurship for all people of Iran in a free market economy. Restoration of the rights of blue-collar workers, farmers, nurses, white-collar workers, teachers, and retirees;
9. Protection and rehabilitation of the environment, which has been massacred under the rule of the mullahs;
10. A non-nuclear Iran that is also devoid of weapons of mass destruction. Peace, co-existence, and international and regional cooperation.

MEK Resistance Units Play Vital Role in Iran's Struggle for Freedom

- The Iranian regime, facing a nation demanding regime change, is currently grappling with significant existential challenges. This is primarily due to the escalating activities of Resistance Units affiliated with the People's Mojahedin Organization of Iran (PMOI/MEK) within the country. These units consist of numerous self-sufficient groups, mainly composed of young men and women.
- Embedded within the social fabric, these Resistance Units are difficult for the regime to eliminate. They are deeply integrated within the general population and the society at large.
- The Resistance Units are expanding their presence throughout Iran. Known for their efficiency and bravery, they actively challenge the regime's strongholds of oppression and terror.
- Their primary goal is to dismantle the atmosphere of fear and repression, highlighting the regime's vulnerabilities and opening the way for the people's uprising. Despite Tehran's relentless attempts to suppress dissent, the Resistance Units continue their mission, significantly influencing the Iranian landscape.
- The regime has been unable to stop the units' growth and expansion, as evidenced by their resilience during the 2022 uprising, where 3,626 members were forcibly disappeared. These units have grown in size, maturity, and operational capability, playing a crucial role in organizing protests and leading uprisings.
- The Resistance Units carried out 20,000 different acts of resistance across virtually all of Iran's 31 provinces, including against the IRGC and paramilitary Basij bases. These acts have included torching regime symbols, hanging large banners with pictures of the Resistance's leadership on overpasses in major thoroughfares, and writing graffiti on walls, all leading up to the Free Iran World Summit 2024, scheduled to begin on June 30, 2024.
- In the face of continuous suppression of women, their actions frequently echo the elevated slogan of Iranian women: "Women, Resistance, Freedom;" and the Iranian public's chant in the 2022 uprising: "Down with the Oppressor, be it the Shah or the Leader (Khamenei)." The also express support for National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI) President-elect Maryam Rajavi and her Ten-Point Plan throughout these activities, highlighting the desire of the Iranian people for a free, democratic, and non-nuclear republic in Iran.

We are deeply concerned by the Iranian regime's ruthless suppression of the people of Iran, including ethnic and religious minorities. During the 2022 uprising, according to the UN Special Rapporteur on the Situation of Human Rights in Iran, "verified videos show security forces deliberately shooting unarmed protesters from a short distance".

Iran remains the world's leading per capita executioner, hanging at least 864 people in 2023. In 1988 alone, 30,000 political prisoners were massacred within weeks following the decree by the regime's Supreme Leader Ruhollah Khomeini to execute affiliates of the People's Mojahedin Organisation of Iran (PMOI/MEK) who persisted in supporting the organisation.

The Iranian regime has recently initiated a farcical trial in absentia for the Iranian Resistance leadership and 100 members of the PMOI, alleging crimes such as Moharebeh (waging war against God). This trial is evidently a pretext for laying the groundwork to commit terrorist acts against them, particularly in Europe, and to pressure European authorities to restrict dissidents, particularly those residing in Ashraf-3, Albania. The Iranian judiciary serves as Khamenei's repressive tool for killing and terrorism.

Europe has become the roaming ground for Iran's state terrorism. In February 2021, a court in Antwerp, Belgium, sentenced a serving Iranian diplomat to 20 years in prison for attempting to bomb the annual summit of the National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI) in a Paris suburb.

The ruling religious dictatorship is incapable of reform. During the 2022 uprising, the Iranian people rejected any form of dictatorship, whether monarchical or theocratic, and called for regime change to establish a democratic republic.

The people of Iran are being denied all of their political and civil rights; whereas, the Preamble to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights underscores the fundamental rights of all human beings, and states: "It is essential, if man is not to be compelled to have recourse, as a last resort, to rebellion against tyranny and oppression, that human rights should be protected by the rule of law".

The Iranian regime is the driving force behind the war in the Middle East and attacks on commercial shipping in the Red Sea. It is also sending drones to be used in the war against the people of Ukraine, in breach of international law. The head of the snake is in Iran. Through proxy groups, the IRGC spreads terrorism and obstructs regional and global peace and security.

1. We condemn the flagrant violations of human rights, particularly the suppression of women, and we call for the perpetrators of the 1988 massacre to be held accountable for ongoing crimes against humanity.
2. The people of Iran deserve a democratic system. We urge all governments to support NCRI President-elect Maryam Rajavi's Ten-point Plan for a democratic republic based on the separation of religion and state and gender equality.
3. We strongly condemn the Iranian regime's actions against Iranian dissidents in Ashraf-3, Albania, and we reaffirm their rights under the 1951 Geneva Convention and the European Convention on Human Rights.
4. As the Iranian regime has blocked all political avenues for change, the free world must, consistent with internationally recognised laws based on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, recognise the rights of the Iranian people and the MEK Resistance Units to rise up and confront the IRGC.
5. We strongly condemn the Iranian regime's destructive role in the Middle East and its belligerent policies. We call for the terrorist designation of the IRGC and the implementation of oil sanctions on the regime.
